Other news: Dates to remember regarding the Kindness Matters Award.

- September 15 October 31: D GST coordinator sends one signed nomination to the multiple district (MD) GST coordinator
- **October 31**: Nominations close. Deadline for MD GST coordinator to send one signed nomination to Lions International and copy the multiple council chairperson.

Dates to remember regarding the MD 19 Global Service Action Plan:

• **October 31** - clubs should be able to identify and contact at least one or two organizations for potential partnerships.

In addition, the DG will send an email or other form of communication to all club presidents and secretaries, to encourage them to complete one service project with another service organization or Lion's club by March 1, 2024.

- December 15 Clubs would select a partner, decide on a collaborative project and report to the Zone Chair.
- December 31 Zone Chairs would report club progress.
- March 1, 2024 The new collaborative service project has been completed.
- March 15, 2024- Each president will send in a picture and description of their collaborative service project to their zone chair. The zone chair and DG will select one collaborative project to represent the zone.
- March 31, 2024 After submissions from every zone have been received, the DG will select one completed collaborative project to represent the district. A picture and description of the project will be sent to the MD19 Border Crossing for publication.
