Getting To Know PDG Steve Brooks

Steve Brooks was born on September 3, 1956 in Everett Washington. At age four, his family moved to Lynnwood where he graduating from Lynnwood High School in 1974. During his youth, he was involved in Scouts and went on to become an Eagle Scout in 1972. For the last seven years, he was the representative from Lake Stevens Lions Club to Boy Scout Troop 43 that the club has sponsored for 58 years now.

While on vacation in Rochester, NY in 1979, Steve met Judy. The next night they went out on a date together. The phone company got rich with lots of long-distance phone calls between them. A few months later Steve visited again over Labor Day weekend and met Judy's family. Judy came to visit Steve that Christmas and went home with an engagement ring. They were married on July 5, 1980 in Rochester. In 1984, they sold their Lynnwood house and moved to Lake Stevens where they still live. They like to go camping in their 35-foot 5th wheel trailer. Steve also likes visiting various places around Washington on his Harley Davidson motorcycle.

During high school, Steve decided he wanted to work in technology. He attended Shoreline



Community College where he received an Associate Degree in Electronics. He went on to earn a Bachelor Science Electronics Engineering Technology degree from Henry Cogswell College with a minor in software engineering. Steve was encouraged by two different employers to go into management. He ignored the requests from the first employer, but after changing jobs the request was strongly encouraged by his employer. He enrolled in the evening MBA program at City University while working full time. Upon graduation in September 2001, he moved into engineering management. He was a hands-on manager working with software engineers and other technical employees to achieve their goals. He is a Senior Member of IEEE and made several patent filings over his career.

Steve has always gotten involved in various things. In 2003, he was encouraged to run for Lake Stevens City Council which he was elected. During his four years on the City Council, his vision of "One Community Around the Lake" was put into place resulting in growing the city from 4,500 residents to the current 36,000 residents. He was the city's representative to the community Aquafest festival board and served at the same time on the Historical Society board.

Steve joined the Lake Stevens Lions in February 2002 after doing several projects with the club. He has held almost all positions in the club except for Treasurer. He is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. He was the MD19 Zone Chair of the Year for Zones up to eight clubs. He has been awarded Lions International Leadership and Presidential Medals for his service. He served as a NW Lions Foundation Trustee for six years. During his term as District Governor for 19-B, his friend, Gary Wolf, from the Kiwanis club in Lake Stevens was also serving as District Governor. Several times the two of them would be visiting the same communities about the same time.

The Oso mudslide occurred on March 22, 2014 while Steve was District Governor. He became responsible for \$30,000 in LCIF grants along with approximately \$120,000 in donations from Lions around the world. LCIF money was used to replace equipment at the Oso and Darrington fire departments not covered by other disaster funds. Refurbishing the old Oso school building into a Community Center with new windows, electrical, heat and WI-FI were areas that money was spent to help the Oso Community. School kids used the community center and WI-FI to help with their virtual learning and not fall behind.


Getting To Know PDG Frank Bega


Since joining Lions, Frank served as District 19-E cabinet secretary under District Governor Gerry Mottl in 2012-13. He's been an active member of the cabinet since that time in one position or another.

He has served as Club President for the Rathdrum Lions Club in 2012-13 and again in 2021-22. He served as Zone Chairperson in Zone E-3 for 2 ½ years, from 2013 through half of 2016. He says of this time, "I have met with, and helped train many wonderful Lions!"

PDG Frank attended the Leadership 101 course in Spokane, WA in 2011 and then followed that up by attending the NW Lions Leadership Institute in Gig Harbor, WA in February of 2012. He is also a graduate of the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute, which was in Calgary, Alberta in March of 2015, attending with PDG Bob Yeoman. Later that same year, in June, he went to the Faculty Development Institute in Oakbrook, Illinois.



Conventions and has held new officer trainings for zones E-3 and E-11. He has been facilitator for MD19 Officer Training. Currently he is his clubs' LCIF Coordinator.



The date/time stamp on the email will also validate its on time submission.

In mid-January the MD19 Office will be **emailing** out to the Club Treasurers or Secretary-Treasurers the **MD19 Second Half Dues Statements**. If no email address is available, a hard copy will be sent to the Treasurer's address as it was recorded on the 2023-2024 LCI Club Officer Report Form (or subsequent updated information received). If you do not receive a dues bill by the end of January, please contact the MD19 Office, so that we can confirm your email or mailing address and resend the bill. Dues for the second half are based on the membership total recorded on the WMMR due December 31, 2023, plus pro-rated dues for any new members brought in from July to December.

District Conventions begin the weekend of March 1st. It is important that the 2023-2024 Second Half Dues have been paid prior to your convention or your voting Delegate(s) will be unable to vote. If you have not received a 2023-2024 Second Half Dues statement, contact the MD19 Office for a copy immediately. Please confirm your club's correct contact information with the MD19 Office at the same time.

Candidates for Higher Office at the Zone & District level: Your letter of intent and your club's (Zone) letter of endorsement must be received by the MD19 Office, the District Governor, and your Zone Chairperson on or before December 31st. This is a Constitutional requirement!

Any Candidate for MD19 Vice Council Chairperson: Your letter of Intent, your Club's and Zone's Letter of Endorsement must be received by the MD19 Office, the District Governor, and the Vice District Governor on or before December 31st. Your district cabinet will also need to approve your endorsement. This is a Constitutional requirement!

CHILLIWACK — Six local Lions Clubs have answered the call from Fraser Health to help replace outdated mammography equipment at Chilliwack General Hospital.

According to a Facebook post from the Chilliwack Dogwood Monarch Lions Club dated October 15, area Lions Club members came together to purchase a state of the art mammography suite at a cost of \$409,400, of which \$129,000 involved a grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation.

The three new machines will serve over 70,000 people in Chilliwack and the surrounding communities well into the future, the Facebook post stated.

"The computerized cutting-edge machines communicate with each other throughout the process," Chillwack Dogwood Monarch Lions Club wrote online. "In one visit a patient can go from screening, to diagnosis and finally biopsy if needed. Wait times are shortened, diagnoses are more accurate and biopsies more precise and less invasive for the patient. This means more patients can be served and earlier diagnoses and treatment will result."

The six clubs involved in this stellar fundraising cause consist of Agassiz Harrison Lions, Chilliwack Lions, Steller's Jay Lions, Mount Cheam Lions, Chilliwack Dogwood Monarch Lions, and Hope Lions.
