March brings another mission trip

LERC provides glasses for PazSalud El Salvador trip

PazSalud (Peace Health) continues to serve patients living in poverty by providing optometry and cataract screening (OCS) missions to the most vulnerable senior members of society. An OCS mission provides a rare opportunity for low income patients to receive an eye exam, prescription glasses, reading glasses, eye lubricating drops, cataract and pterygium screening and as needed a referral for opthalmological care in the national healthcare system.

Quick Facts:

What: OCS screening focusing on optometry services, eye exams delivering distance and reading glasses, and screening patients for cataracts and pterygia.

When: Saturday, March 23, 2024. Where: Santa Tecia, El Salvador.

Who: PazSalud served economically marginalized seniors living in the area.

Team: PazSalud assembled the following team to carry out the OCS: ▶ University of Dr. Andres Bello (UNAB), ▶ Our Lady of Grace Parish, ▶ Northwest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center ▶ Wisconsin Lions Foundation Eyeglass Recycling Center.

Stats:

- 232 low-income patients received comprehensive eye exams,
- 253 pairs of distance and/or reading glasses prescribed,
- 29 patients with cataracts identified and given referrals for possible surgery,
- 53 bottles of eye lubricant distributed
- 53 optometrists from the UNAB provided service

NW LERC provided 1500 pairs of readers for this Peru campaign

To all of you who have supported the work of the Lions here in Peru, my heartfelt thanks. It has been a trip with some challenges and some wonderful successes. The first challenge was simply getting out of Portland and to Peru. After a 36-hour trip, we finally made it. Once in Lima, we had our second challenge when customs impounded four of the five bags of reading glasses and other supplies. They allowed us to travel on with one bag that allowed us to do some vision campaigns over the week. The bags are still in Lima but after a consultation with customs in Chiclayo, my writing a donation letter, and the local Lions working with the Municipality of Lambayeque, it seems there is a way forward to get them out of impound and on to Lambayeque. It has been a learning curve that should point the way to better document preparation in the future.

We were not the only ones with travel difficulties as fellow Lion Tom Carter could not escape his house atop an icy hill. He arrived on Monday afternoon to begin his water quality work with local communities, work he has been pursuing for 20 years in retirement. It was a bit of a homecoming for Tom as he had served in the Peace Corps in the early 60s in the port town of Chimbote.









Though we stumbled out of the blocks, we accomplished a good deal in the week. Beth and I were welcomed by community members of Mocce Antiguo, a community we had supported with the rehabilitation of a preschool. After showing us all the enhancements done on the school, we committed to the installation of a water system, essentially a tank and piping that will provide consistent water as the municipal system only supplies water several hours a day. Tom worked with community members to test the water. On Friday, we returned to the preschool to present results of the water testing along with a water safety presentation, screen school children for eyeglass needs with the new Spot Vision Screener, and a distribution of reading glasses using simple diopter eye charts.

On Saturday we traveled to a rice farming community where Tom Carter presented his water quality program. We also did a small distribution of reading glasses.

The Lions in Lambayeque have already begun identifying school children in need of prescription glasses and supplying them with the necessary exam and glasses. This is a great start to using the Spot for finding those children in need of glasses. I was able to provide some training around the Spot and Lions were able to use it at Mocce.

Washing and polishing glasses is urgent! Please have as many volunteers as possible carry out this activity. You will see a new, large sign at the signin desk, a reminder of the need – <u>provide much</u> needed lens tech-ready glasses!



When boxing glasses for recycle, please stack them in rows and layers in the boxes. This method of packing provides a volume of 3 to 5 more pounds per box, a much more efficient use of our recycle boxes - \$ saved!



We will have available the week of April 15 a paper form to be attached to completed boxes of clean/polished glasses, indicating type of glasses (SV, MV, Suns) and date placed on the shelf for lens techs. Forms

will be placed on the polishing tables and also in office desk files. Please ensure your volunteers comply – less confusion about contents of boxes!


