It takes a lot of volunteers to help us accomplish our vital Northwest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center mission of "Changing Lives. One Pair of Eyeglasses at a Time. In our twenty-one years of operation, we have received and processed over 3.8 million pairs of glasses through our facility. Of these, only 327,000 selected pairs have met our rigorous optical standards and been deemed good enough to be sent on 391 missions.

For many years, our mission fulfillment was done by Berta Fender, who has handed off this important responsibility on to other volunteers to complete. Meet Malena Hine and Frankie Sokso, our mission fulfillment volunteers!

If you go into the back room of our facility you will see neatly arranged boxes containing hundreds and hundreds of pairs of mission-ready eyeglasses, waiting for customers. And you will often find Malena and Frankie there, working to fulfill the orders that come in from around the world. Mission providers send us a request for certain numbers of eyeglasses in certain prescription strengths. They may also want reading glasses and non-prescription sunglasses in their order. Malena and Frankie do their best to accommodate these orders, select the appropriate glasses and arrange shipping that is paid for by the mission providers.

Malena and Frankie are doing a great job and I am pleased to spotlight them this month!

## Other Activity

Late April, Larry Stewart from Texas LERC called and confirmed they will accept our excess supply of single vision (-) eyeglasses. We're in agreement that once per month we will be sending them 1000 pairs of eyeglasses following the USPS Publication 347 guidelines. Mid - June another express shipment of 1,000 single vision eyeglasses will be sent to Texas LERC.

In April, Peace Health / Paz Salud fitted 600 individuals with eyeglasses during their missions in San Julian and Izalco, El Salvador. Darren Streff sends his thanks and appreciation to all the Lions for their continued support.

In May, iCARE Director Steven Stern thanked Northwest LERC for the donation of the lenometer and Lisa Ikeda for transporting it to and from the Bahamas and in June delivered it to him once back in Washington.

## All Clubs - A Friendly Reminder - Eyeglass Drop-off/Collection Box Maintenance

• Please ensure your club's full name is listed on the box or bag when dropping off eyeglasses to NWLERC to receive proper credit, as other clubs may have similar names.

• Regularly check and maintain your club's eyeglass collection boxes within your community to prevent overfilling and potential damage to the glasses.



• Clearly label each collection box with your club's contact information for pickup. NWLERC receives numerous calls and emails requesting pickup, and it's often difficult to determine which club is responsible for each location.

• Additionally, please email us at nwlercmedia@gmail.com with an updated list of your club's collection box locations. We continue to receive frequent requests for drop-off sites, and our website list has not been updated since before COVID.

#### On-site Site Managers and Lensometer Technicians are currently in high demand at NWLERC.

**Site Managers** helps with the day-to-day operations of NWLERC, ensuring everything runs smoothly for our volunteers and the community we serve. Volunteers can request their schedules, and we currently have shifts available on Thursdays from 9am to noon, as well as afternoon shifts.

**Lensometer Technicians** play a key role in our eyeglass recycling process by reading prescriptions after the glasses have been sorted, washed, and polished.



If you can spare 4 or more hours a month, we would be incredibly grateful for your time and energy. Training is available for both positions — no experience necessary, just a willingness to learn and a heart to serve.

## Other key positions needing dedicated volunteers at NWLERC

**VP** - **Administration:** Help keep our office organized by managing operations and handling correspondence. Help ensure everything runs efficiently.

**VP** - **Operations:** Help oversee daily activities, manage resources, and help oversee coordinate work with others to keep things running smoothly.

## Bringing Vision and Hope to the Bahamas:

PDG Lisa Ikeda, VP-Marketing Chair for NWLERC, recently participated in a Vision Mission with iCARE in the Bahamas, traveling between Nassau and Exuma islands.

Before her departure, Lisa trained over 40 hours to use a lensometer.



NWLERC voted to donate a discontinued lensometer for her to take on the mission. While iCARE has previously requested used glasses from NWLERC, they have shifted in recent years to using only new glasses.

The mission team was composed of 21 dedicated volunteers, including (retired/practicing) ophthalmologists, optometrists, opticians, a nurse, 2 recent medical graduates, and other support personnel from the US. Lisa was the only volunteer affliated with Lions and/or LERC. The scope of the mission was exceptional: 12 clinics were set up and dismantled, including visits to 10 different school locations, with 11 schools served on Exuma Island alone. Over four clinic days, the team provided care to over 1,384 patients across the two islands. The team dispensed 329 prescription glasses (303 to be custom made) distributed and donated 760 reading glasses and 700 sunglasses. The optical team has placed custom orders, and a smaller team will return this September to the Bahamas to provide the custom glasses.

Lisa expresses her deep appreciation to NWLERC for their support in training and donating a lensometer to iCARE, and also to the Camas Lions Club for organizing a GoFundMe, and to those donating to support her in this life-changing journey.
